Parliamentary officials attended our campaign launch event, including MPs, Lords, and Ministers, with speeches from Virginia Crosbie MP, Chloe Smith MP, and Mims Davies MP as well as stories and performances from Deaf community leaders, parents, and schools.

In your email, explain why early access to BSL is vital for Deaf children and their families. Emphasise your support for:

- 1 Funding free access to BSL for families of newly identified Deaf children.
- 2 Ensuring the highest standards of BSL teaching, including fluent Deaf and native signers.
- 3 Implementing these changes nationwide.




